



Hi. I am a fused glass artist based in Southam, Warwickshire. Over the past few years I have been able to spend time experimenting and enjoying my craft and I love to explore new techniques. My inspirations come from the sheer joy of the interaction between colour and light, along with the natural world that I see around me.

Through this document you will see the results of a range of ways of fusing glass. Some pieces are made using hand cut glass which I do with the tools pictured here. I do not use a machine to cut any of my glass. To refine the shapes I have my trusty grinder and at the top you can see pictures of my wonderful kiln, also known as my little dragon.

Other ways of fusing with glass that I use are sprinkling small chips of coloured glass called frit, glass beads which I make myself, glass powder which is particularly effective sieved over clear glass, metallic powder called mica which looks great with my own hand cut stencils, 1mm or 2mm thin rods of glass called stringers and painting with glass enamels. Some pieces are even suitable to be personalized with a name or date. Visit my social media pages to see video clips of me making.

The main draw of glass is the way it catches the light in a sunny spot. I love making suncatchers and have recently started to create my Heart of Glass pieces. Prices start at £22







Bubble bowls



To make my bubble bowls I first need to make a couple of kiln loads of bubbles! Each bowl takes two layers as it is important that each bubble fuses to as many others as possible. As the bubbles are round there will always be gaps between them so they are not water tight. I have been told to warn everyone that you can not eat your cereal out of them! Approx 15cm diameter £39

Square bowls




Square bowls are amazing for letting the natural qualities of the glass take center stage. To make these I use special types of glass such as streaky or iridescent. They really benefit from being in a sunny spot with the light shining on them and photographs really do not catch all the colours. £39





Pictures

I love making pictures using glass powder, frit, stringers and my imagination. Some of these pieces are commissions where my customer has either given me a picture to work from or their idea and left it up to my interpretation. Prices start at £29 for an 18 x 13 cm picture.



Waves



These freestanding waves are an amazing way to show off the colours in the glass with the sunlight shining through. I make one for each season, a water wave and a daisy wave. £39.
